UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS

Admission in the University is a declaration of acceptance of all University rules and regulations.

The University expects its students to maintain a high standard of scholarship, of character, and of consideration for others. A student whose conduct or influence is detrimental to the best interest of the student body may be requested to withdraw.

Drinking of alcohol on campus, gambling, hazing, dishonesty, immoral conduct, and any other behavior unbefitting a student of Southern Methodist University render the student liable to disciplinary action. In addition, it should be remembered that even off campus, a student should conduct himself in a responsible manner at all times. Flagrant misconduct or continuous violation of the rules and regulations will merit suspension or expulsion, as determined by The Faculty Committee on Discipline.

Each student agrees to leave the University and University neighborhood quietly and immediately when so requested. This is directed to do so by a constituted disciplinary authority of the University. Such student is suspended or removed from campus except for general school business during the period of ban.

The Deans of Men and Women concur with the administration and enforcement of policies established by The Faculty Committee on Discipline.

The faculty welcomes the hearty cooperation of the Students' Association in the maintenance of high standards, and relies upon student sentiment and leadership in student self-government to support good conduct. Cooperation is enhanced by student participation on several faculty and administrative committees.

Church Attendance.—All students are urged to attend church services.

Loss of personal property.—The University is not responsible for the loss of personal property belonging to students in any building owned by the University, whether the loss results from theft, fire, or unknown cause.

Physical Education.—All freshmen, sophomores, juniors, whatever their purpose in attending the University, are required to take physical education or the Air Force ROTC General Military Course (for men) and must represent this university in these courses to fulfill graduation requirements.
